## 2. Declarations of interest received in writing:

## 3. Minutes:

The minutes of the meeting of Cefn Cribwr Community Council held on Wednesday 11th December 2024 were adopted and signed as a true record.

## 4. Matters arising:

*BCBC Town & Community Council Fund 2025:* The Clerk reported he had spoken with Mr. Geoff Whittington for advice regarding possible ways to increase and enhance the biodiversity in the village. Mr Whittington suggested that he could produce a masterplan for the road corridor, identifying sites for environmental improvements, and make recommendations together with a development plan with costings. He would also look at potential funding through BCBCs biodiversity enhancement program. This would take 3 days at £400/day so the fee would be £1200. It was unanimously agreed to proceed on this basis.

War Memorial: The Clerk reported that work on the war memorial would commence in the new year.

## 7. Members Report:

*School Crossing Patrol Officer:* Cllr. H. J. David reported that this position has been advertised twice but, to date, no applications have been received. It is hoped this vital job in our community will be filled soon.

*Heronsbridge School:* Cllr. H. J. David reported that plans are moving ahead for the relocation of Heronsbridge School and its expansion to offer an additional sixty places with residential provision. The estimated cost of the project is £58 million.

*Storm Bert*: Cllr. H. J. David reported that storm Bert had caused considerable damage across the County Borough.Lots of trees have been brought down and the repair cost of one section of the Bwlch Road has been estimated at £131,000.

*BCBC Budget* 2025-26: Cllr. H. J. David reported that the proposed budget recommends an increase of 4.5% in Council Tax. This is due to ever-increasing costs: £4.5 million in NI contributions, increased living wage, and pay scale requirements. Education and social care costs continue to increase exponentially compared to inflation. Pre-pandemic there were approximately 150 children requiring specialist support.That has now risen to over 300 and there are 33 children in specialist residential care because of their complex needs. £9.5 million in savings will also need to be found. Further information can be found at the consultation page on the BCBC website.

## 8. Any other business:

*Community Apple Trees:* The Clerk reported that Mr. M. Reynolds had contacted Council regarding the offer of 30 apple trees from Thatchers Cider, which are free to the community if they are planted where the public have access to them. Members thought this was a positive idea and suggested that an area at Cae Gof might be a suitable location for some of the trees. It was agreed the Clerk would approach the Athletic Club in the first instance.

*Dog Fouling:* The Clerk reported that he had contacted Mr. S. Powell regarding the ongoing problems of dog fouling at Cae Gof. Members expressed their concern and all cited personal experience about this growing problem across the village. The Clerk queried the powers of BCBC enforcement and Cllr. H. J. David confirmed that the powers don't exist / have expired. He agreed to ask for an update on timescale for the new regulations / bylaws. It was suggested that more signage and bins may make a difference at Cae Gof. Also asking Mr. Howells to make the school children aware of the problems this causes.

For what purpose do you require funding? - We aim to use our Military Veteran Role Models to bring the children from our community together to conduct a Health and well-being day that will concentrate on Building Resilience, working on communication and team building challenges for children and young adults in the Cefn Cribwr Community Council ward. Delivery of the health; Well-Being and Building resilience sessions that will take place at a location central to Cefn Cribwr Community Council ward residents. Engaging schools, Youth groups, sports clubs and community organisations in Cefn Cribwr . Beneficiaries will be aged between 7-25 years of age. We will utilize social media to engage with stakeholders and our extensive database of contacts from previous programs within schools; community groups and sports clubs. On all sessions that are delivered we will ensure that feedback forms are conducted to gage learner feedback from the young attendees through their own learners voice; this will be conducted through a google form link; we will also ask the parents/ carers to complete a feedback form; all this information will be collated after each session delivered. We have delivered similar projects in partnership with a number of community councils in 2024 including Bridgend Town Council, Cowbridge Town council and Coity Higher Community Council with fantastic results. We also worked with a Welsh Government project this was specifically aimed at service children and the results were brilliant; we wanted to ensure that we could provide these sessions to all children and young adults to remain all inclusive; not just at one group hence this application. Our sessions will bring young people together to build strong relationships and make them thrive within the local community eg; In Cefn Cribwr we would bring young people together from across the Cefn Cribwr Community Council ward Area where we would deliver the sessions. During these sessions we will be giving the young people tips on health and well-being whilst focusing on improving team work; communication and leadership skills these are all skills that are needed to build a stronger community.

We have held Regular communication with pupils/parents and schools has given us first hand feedback that they are missing a sense of doing things together making new friends and being active. It is vital that we promote a sense of togetherness and cohesion. This project is an ideal way to support mental health/fitness for our children. our aim is to deliver a full day with around 40-50 attendees on the day. This works out at the cost of £10 per head per child. There will be no costs for any child to attend the days they will be free to attend and be delivered in the spring/ summer, and all social media post will credit Cefn Cribwr Community Council


